He lay on his back and slipped his arms into William's front legs. Then he wriggled his legs into William's back legs. His head fitted perfectly inside the cat's head. Using his paws, Peter was able to zip himself up easily. He stood, and took a few steps. What a delight to walk on four soft white paws. He could see his whiskers springing out from the sides of his face, and he felt his tail curling behind him. His tread was light, and his fur was like the most comfortable of old woollen jumpers. As his pleasure in being a cat grew, a tingling action deep in his throat became so strong that he could hear himself, Peter was purring. He was Peter Cat.
