




SECTION A (25 marks)

Study Figure 1 which shows the forecasted average annual growth in different sectors of the economy




- a) Tourism is projected to be the fourth fastest growth sector between 2010-2020.

Question 3


Study the map extract which shows an extract of the Suffolk coast in East Anglia. Credit will be given for effective reference to the map.

- a) Compare the physical characteristics of grid squares 3851 and 4049. [4]
- b) With reference to the map extract, suggest why Orford is a popular place for tourists to visit. [6]
- c) Study Figure 3, a photograph of Woodbridge Airfield looking due East. Woodfield Airfield is a former Royal Air Force station.

With the use of the photo and the OS map extract, discuss the environmental issues which may arise from the reopening of Woodbridge Airfield as a regional commercial airport. [6]
